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### Restaurant's roots are in San Marino

With the opening of the Tre Monti Ristorante in Troy, residents will have a new choice for dinner, but they will also get a glimpse into the world's smallest republic, San Marino, and its unique cuisine.

Tre Monti Ristorante opened Tuesday, March 4, at 1695 Big Beaver in Troy, just east of Rochester Road behind the San Marino Club. There is no other restaurant in the U.S. that features dishes from San Marino, according to a press release. The area boasts the largest population of immigrants from San Marino in the nation.

With the opening of Tre Monti, diners will experience pasta made daily by Maddalena Sarti of San Marino, who utilizes her handed down recipes. She works with Chef Richard Conover who has decades of experience cooking and managing restaurants in the area.

The sauces are made from scratch. There are no dishes prepared with heavy creams or sauces, so the meat and fish is highlighted. Fresh fish is flown in daily.

Tre Monti Ristorante is named for the three-peaked, 2,437 foot high Mont Titano, which dominates the country of San Marino that is completely surrounded by Italy.

The restaurant is designed by the award-winning architectural firm of Dominic Tringali, with the restaurant interior by the renowned Ron Rea, of Ron and Roman of Birmingham.

The restaurant includes several rooms for private dining and corporate functions and patio dining. Carry out and lunch will be added in the coming months.
